Graham Medical Clinic and your insurance company have partnered together to complete your Annual Medicare Wellness Visit. This is an important free visit that allows us to develop and update your personalized prevention plan for better health. Medicare no longer covers what was once considered "the annual physical exam".

For your convenience we try to combine this visit with your routine follow ups. This may include reviewing lab work or other diagnostic studies, following up on chronic conditions, refilling medications, or a physical exam to name a few examples. In addition, you may have a question or concern that you want to discuss with your physician. This part of the visit will also be submitted to your insurance and therefore could be subject to copayments and/or deductibles. There are a few insurance companies that require two separate visits. If your Annual Medicare Wellness Visit and routine follow up/problem visit are scheduled on separate days it is likely a requirement of your health insurance company.

We appreciate the trust you put in us to take care of your health care needs and look forward to seeing you at your annual visit.

Aledade Accountable Care 15, LLC, an Accountable Care

Organization (ACO). An ACO is a group of doctors, hospitals, and/or other health care providers that work together to improve the quality and experience of care you receive. ACOs receive a portion of any savings that result from reducing costs and meeting quality requirements.

- ▶ Medicare evaluates how well each ACO meets these goals every year. Those ACOs that do a good job can earn a financial bonus. ACOs that earn a bonus may use the payment to invest more in your care or share a portion directly with your providers. ACOs may owe a penalty if their care increases costs.
- ▶ our Aledade Accountable Care 15, LLC participation in Aledade Accountable Care 15, LLC doesn't limit your choice of health care providers. Your Medicare benefits are not changing. You still have the right to visit any doctor, hospital, or other provider that accepts Medicare at any time, just like you do now.
- ▶ To help us coordinate your health care better, Medicare shares information about your care with your providers. If you don't want Medicare to share your health care information, call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).



How do ACOs work?

- ▶ An ACO **isn't** a Medicare Advantage plan which is an "all in one" alternative to Original Medicare, offered by private companies approved by Medicare. An ACO **isn't** an HMO plan, or an insurance plan of any kind. Important!
- ▶ ACOs have agreements with Medicare to be financially accountable for the quality, cost, and experience of care you receive.
- ▶ Coordinated care can avoid wasted time and costs for repeated tests and unneeded appointments. It may make it easier to spot potential problems before they become more serious – like drug interactions that can happen if one doctor isn't aware of what another has prescribed.
- ▶ ACOs may use electronic health records, case managers, and electronic prescriptions to help you stay healthy. Some ACOs have special programs to encourage you to have a primary care visit or use their care management team. Participation in these programs is optional.
- ▶ Physicians and other practitioners who are participating in our ACO can provide telehealth services to our patients, regardless of whether you live in a rural or urban area. These telehealth services may allow you to receive certain health care services from the comfort of your home, or from another location, as you communicate in real time with your primary care practitioner or specialist. Telehealth services may include managing your prescriptions, nutrition therapy, behavioral assessment and therapy, and many other services; however, not all services can be provided via telehealth. What information will be shared about me?

- ▶ Medicare shares information about your care with your health care providers; like dates and times you visited a health care provider, your medical conditions, and a list of past and current prescriptions. This information helps Aledade Accountable Care 15, LLC track the care and tests that you've already had.
- ▶ Sharing your data helps make sure all the providers involved in your care have access to your health information when and where they need it.
